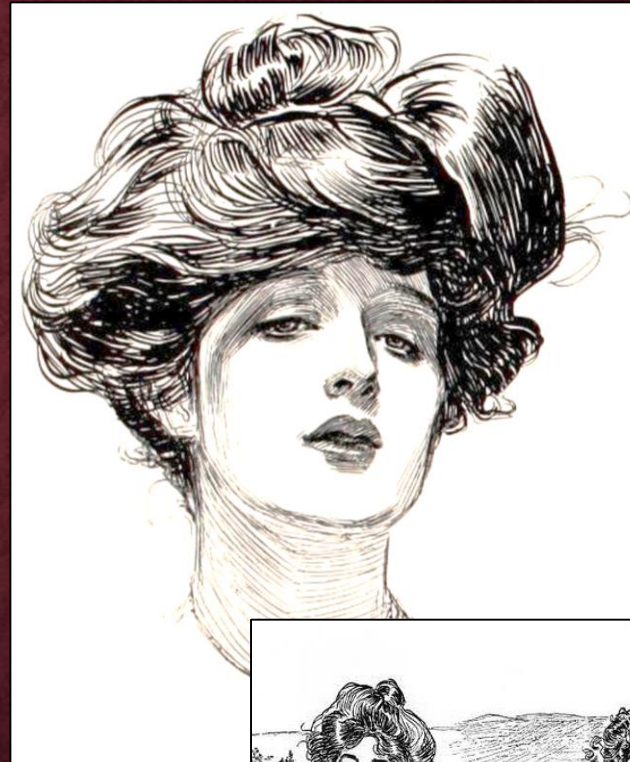

1890's

The Victorian Era

• Gibson Girl

- Ideal of feminine beauty.
- Illustrations by artist Charles Dana Gibson.
- Women would model their clothes, gestures, hair and features after the Gibson Girl.

The Victorian Era

• Corset

- Device to flatten stomach and shrink the waist.
- Laced up in the back.
- Very restrictive and could cause disfigurement.

- Device worn under women's skirts to make the backside look bigger.

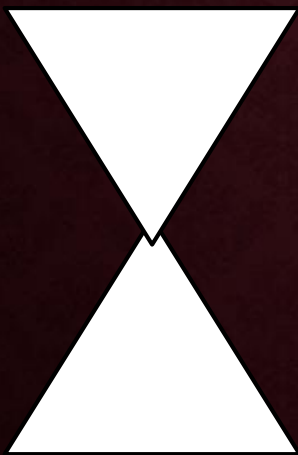

- Hourglass

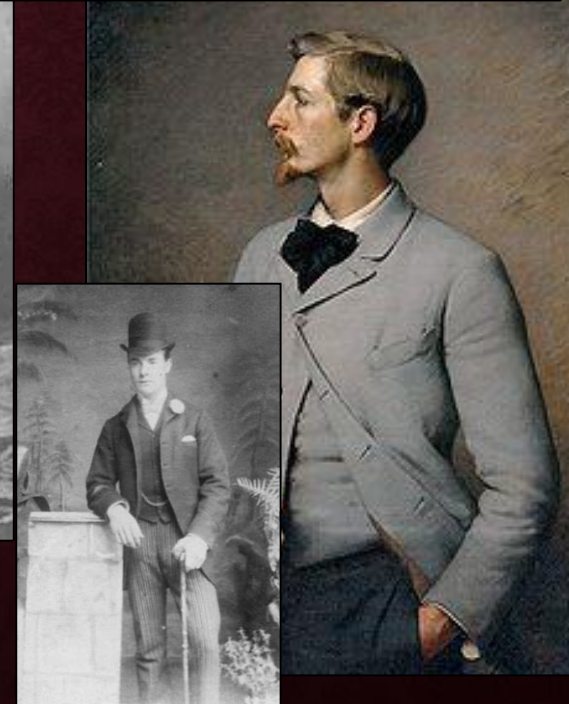
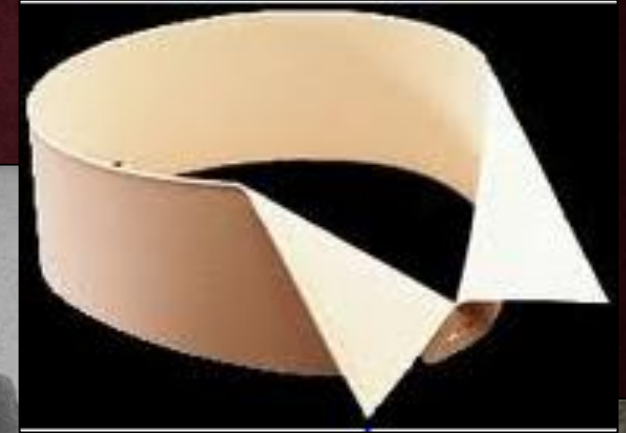

1900's

The Industrial Revolution Era

• Duster Coat

- Full length coat worn by both men and women to protect their clothing when riding in open motor cars on dirt roads of the day.

The Industrial Revolution Era

• Shirtwaist

- A blouse with buttons down the front that was separate from the skirt.
- Allowed more freedom of movement.

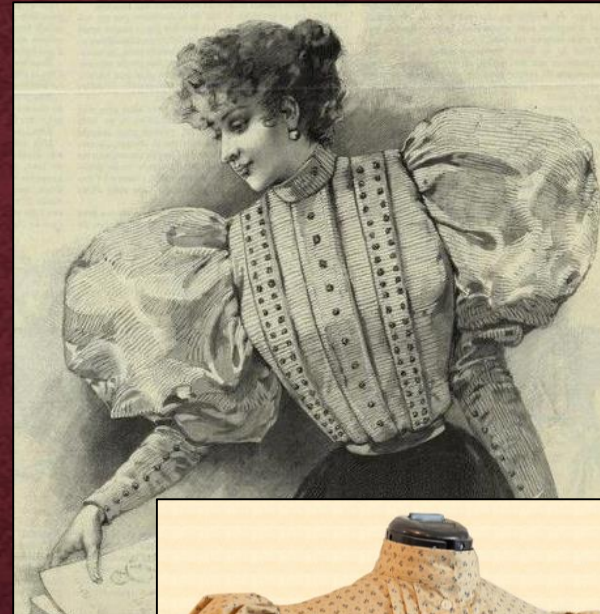

• Leg-O-Mutton Sleeve

- Sleeves that are very full at the shoulder, taper in and become tighter at the elbow to the wrist.



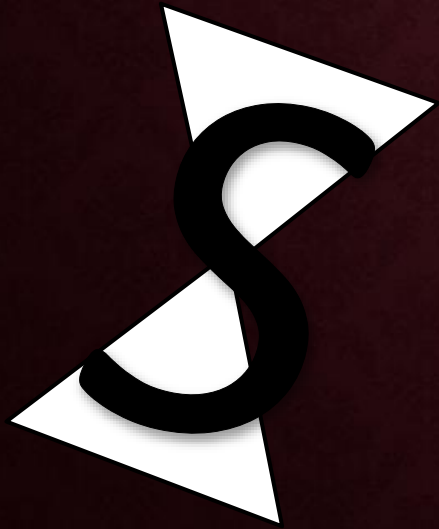
1900's

• Silhouette

- S-Curve

- Corsets pushed the chest out forcing the hips to go back creating the "S" shape.
- Bustles never returned.
