1. Harmony

- Harmony is created by following the principles (rules) of design when using the elements of design (tools).
- Harmony is most pleasing when it has both <u>UNITY</u> and <u>VARIETY</u>.
- All of the design elements are contributing to make a harmonious whole.



2. Variety

 Uses multiple elements of design to add interest and excitement to the





3. Unity

 Repeats one or more of the elements of the design to tie the outfit together.



- Varity: (What is different?)
 - Texture below the skirt,
 flower above. Contrasting
 color in the sash.
- Unity: (What is the same?)
 - Repetition of red and black.



- Varity: (What is different?)
 - Flower detail, ruffle down the side front.
- Unity: (What is the same?)
 - Same color throughout,
 fitted, repeating lines.



- Varity: (What is different?)
 - Pop of red color on the belt.
- Unity: (What is the same?)
 - Royal purple color repeated in the skirt and blouse.



- Varity: (What is different?)
 - Pop of color with matching bag and shoes.
- Unity: (What is the same?)
 - All over polka-dot pattern throughout the dress.



- Varity: (What is different?)
 - Different fabrics for the top and skirt.
- Unity: (What is the same?)
 - Cream color throughout the outfit.
